Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held at Cressage Village Hall on Tuesday 8th July 2025 at 7pm

In attendance: Cllrs Rob Davies, John Esp, Victoria Todd, Roger Beardsmore, Shaun Bott, 3 members of the public, Shropshire Councillor Dan Thomas and the Parish Clerk

37.25 Chairman's welcome

The Chairman welcomed everyone to the meeting

38.25 To note Apologies

Apologies were received from Cllr Matthew Murray (work commitment), and Cllr Colin Campbell (Annual Leave). An apology was received from Shropshire Councillor Susan (alternative commitment).

39.25 To note Declarations of Pecuniary Interest or consider dispensation requests

40.25 Public session

The Parish Clerk noted that she had received correspondence from members of the public about the installation of the village gateway. Two residents had asked for the 30mph speed enforcement area to be extended, and a third had complained that the cutting of the hedge at the Shrewsbury end of the village was aggressive and had left a hole in it. Cllr Todd said she had also received correspondence about it. The speed limit is a matter for the Highways authority. The Parish Council does not have a remit to address this but can pass on the concern. Regarding the hedge, Councillors agreed it was aggressive but did not see it as a long term problem.

A member of the public said that he had written to Shropshire Council about the different standards in cutting along the A458 between Bridgnorth and Much Wenlock. He had been told to report it via Fix My Street and upload photographs, however, this was a general issue about working to a contract specification and not a specific problem. In his view, the Parish Council had addressed some of the issue by doing an extra cut at the Wig Wig turn.

A member of the public said that diversions at Much Wenlock for works undertaken during the day had been very poor. He referred to closure between Morville and Tasley. Another resident present at the meeting agreed with this view.

A member of the public said that a hedge on Severn Way by the shop was impeding on the footpath. Cllr Victoria Todd said that she would speak to the property owner about it.

41.25 Shropshire Councillor's Report

Cllr Dan Thomas reported that he had attended a meeting about the Leisure Centre at Much Wenlock, this had included discussion about improving accessibility and overall viability of the

centre. CiL money may be used as part of this future. The trust is considering the possibility of Halo taking over the centre.

Cllr Susan Coleman has been working with Severn Trent to resolve drainage issues in Cressage.

Cllr Dan Thomas will be holding a surgery on July 12th in Much Wenlock. Residents are welcome to come along with any issues they may want him to look into.

The North West Relief Road scheme is 'dead in the water'. There is a question about the money already spent on it will need to be paid back. If so, it could bankrupt Shropshire Council. Shropshire Councillors Susan Coleman and Dan Thomas will both report back to the Parish Council with any updates on this issue.

- i. Recreation ground: it was agreed to discuss the maintenance of leylandii trees backing onto the recreation ground at the September meeting. A letter is to be drafted to the responsible homeowner about the removal of the fallen tree
- ii. Verges: there will be further discussion on cutting verges in the Parish in September
- iii. Footpaths: Fix My Street reports have been filed about outstanding footpath works. Cllr Susan Colemore will be following this up.
- iv. Email logo: it was agreed to choose a logo after the meeting. Cllr Rob Davies had options prepared, and had worked with local school children on this project.
